In addition, will offer two more classes for 2nd and 3rd sessions during the day only; these are offered online with no more than 35 students per class. OTAN provides free professional development for WIOA funded agencies. This includes Google G Suites, Microsoft 365, Distance Education training and individualized training based on needs.

Also collaborating with ESL Technology Coordinator to provide professional development on how to share instructor lessons in the SDCCD Commons and how to license their original work using Creative Commons licensing.

- ✓ Innovation Catalyst Intuit- Nate Sachdeva, SDUSD

Met Intuit in the spring. Set up an Entrepreneurship Week that consisted of a social challenge. Had over 600 students participate from all over the district. Students were paired up with students from other high schools and grade levels to develop a solution to a social problem they felt was needed in their community. All participants received \$10 gift cards from Starbucks, the winning teams received iPads, and the three finalists received air pods.

At the conclusion of the Entrepreneurship Week, a career readiness conference was held with guest speaker, Daymond John, founder of FUBU. Students also had the chance to join breakout sessions that provided an opportunity to speak to professionals in their career of interest to learn personal journeys and opportunities available in that career.

- ✓ December Counselor Conference Updates- Alex Berry, SDCE and Al Love, SD County Office of Education

Regional Strong Workforce Counselor Conference held. Discussed the World of Work today; a YouTube recording of the keynote and the endnote are available. Shared regional priority sector handouts, which will be placed on the myworkforceconnections.org website. The Career Ed Guide is also available virtually and in hard copy.



Upcoming regional workgroup to occur on December 16th. This is the first K-14 community of practice. Will likely have other adult education representatives present.

Career Pathways Workgroup focusing on development of a CTE program finder tool that will be unveiled in January. It will help identify all of the K-14 programs available. This tool will be useful to all of the different stakeholders interested in CTE program outreach.

READ San Diego Partnerships- Leah Gaultieri, SDCE

Met with Valerie Hardy, the Director of READ San Diego to discuss digital literacy challenges and needs in the community. Looking to utilize multiple marketing methods, including a monthly Newsletter sent out to their tutors, libraries and subscribers to share about our CTE programs.

Discussed inviting Jose Cruz, Executive Director of the Council on Literacy. He will have a lot of statistical information that may be helpful. He could also add to the discussion of digital literacy to help identify GAPs and opportunities for our students in this new learning environment.

Since SDCE does not have a tutoring program, we may be able to partnership with READ San Diego to collaborate and offer tutoring opportunities for our students in the future.

Strategic Plan: Data Informed Decision Making- Kelly Henwood, SDCE

Data can be helpful for understanding and supporting transitions between SDUSD Adult Education and SDCE. Shared some guiding principles to help make better data informed decisions. Also, shared potential data needs and discussed next steps on what to do.

Discussed creating a short-term Ad Hoc Workgroup to assist in this area. Proposed a January meeting for an Ad Hoc workgroup. May want to invite someone from the district to join at some point in the future.

✓ **Gateway Recruitment**

The WIOA Gateway will sunset on June 30. While the program is ramping up to end the contract, students are still being recruited to meet annual goals set. Stephanie Lewis will coordinate with Al Love to identify students for the program. She suggested setting up an orientation to provide potential students general information about the program.

✓ **SDCE Workforce Collaborations**

SDCE applied to four separate grants specific to the individual populations: African American Youth, Homeless Youth, Refugee and Immigrant Youth, and Justice Reform Youth. The grant would allow SDCE to serve 113 students in each grant, count wide. Grants were submitted on December 2.

Students will be required to complete the first tier of the Basic Educational Skills Training before starting in any program, whether it be high school diploma, high school equivalency or career training. This includes 4-5 courses to complete and students to be paid \$10 an hour to take these classes, and receive an incentive of \$100 when they finish the class.

In addition, the staffing will look very different. SDCE will be required to have peer mentors, adult mentors, and career navigators and provide workplace work-based learning, job shadowing, on the job training and ultimately, employment. In addition, the grant will allow for paid internship opportunities of 90 hours and 10 hours of volunteer on the job training before a student can be paid.

✓ **Promise**

Coming to SDCE. The first part of the Promise Program requires students to complete a FAFSA. Last year, in collaboration with Outreach, Promise workshops were held at each of the individual campuses. This gave students detailed information on who to connect with at the campuses when they started their programs. These workshops will continue again this year.

The San Diego Promise is a two-year completion program designed to ensure students complete their educational goal whether it be to earn a certificate of completion and enter the workforce, complete an associate degree, or transfer to a university.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Up to two years of free tuition and health fees
- Book grants for eligible students
- Access to Peer Mentors/Success Coach
- Individualized counseling and guidance support to help you complete your educational goals

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- **Must be a first-time college student**
- Must be a class of 2021 high school graduate (H.S. Diploma or GED)
- Must be a California resident or AB 540 eligible
- Must maintain a 2.0 college GPA
- Must enroll in and maintain a minimum of 12 units each semester*

*Does not apply to DSPS students with eligible academic accommodations

SDCE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Must have a HSD/GED or HiSet PRIOR
- Complete a Promise Application (Available in Mid-February)
- Complete College and Career Readiness Class
- Attend a FASFA workshop
- Attend a PROMISE workshop (Dates TBD)
